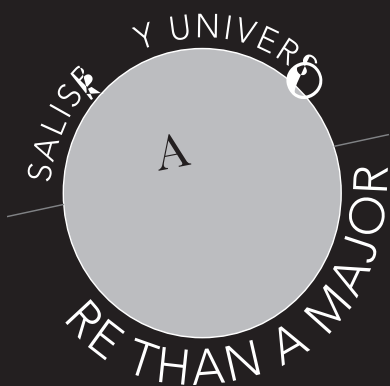

Psychology of Science, Pseudoscience and Truthiness

What is the difference between science and pseudoscience? How do we know when we are being misled? This course explores the psychology of science, pseudoscience, and truthiness. We will examine the history of science, the role of the scientific method, and the impact of cognitive biases on our understanding of the world. We will also explore the concept of truthiness, the idea that we believe what we want to believe, regardless of the facts. This course is designed to help students develop critical thinking skills and a deeper understanding of the scientific process.
